

DESIGN TRENDS 2022




BIOPHILIA

From biophilic-inspired prints to rich jewel tones, green is definitely having a moment. Spring/Summer 2022 runways reflected new citrus-based shades, updated palms and painterly floral motifs. Volume and fringe mark the return to “dressing up”. In the home space, shimmering fringe inspired tile, modern botanical prints and bold expressions of green create bold looks. Pair with high-contrast black and white for an extra dose of drama.



BOLD EMBELLISHMENT

Sunset-inspired color combinations were abundant on Spring/Summer 2022 runways, especially the bold combination of digital lavender mixed with yellow and coral tones for a jolt of optimistic color therapy. A boho-disco theme is building with equal parts glam and free-spirit. Tiered ruffles, long silhouettes and disco ball-inspired shimmer abound. In the home space, we see more fearless decor and self-expression through color and mixed prints.



WARMING NEUTRALS


Earth toned neutrals warmed up the runways for Spring/Summer 2022. Vegan leathers were a driving theme, especially in rich tones of chocolate and camel. Metallics leaned bronze and copper, and shocks of vibrant color interjected in otherwise neutral palettes drove interest. In the home space, we see a return to warm wood and sustainable materials like cork. Clay-based tones and desert-inspired decor continue to inspire interiors.



GEOMETRIC MINIMALISM

Many of the Spring/Summer 2022 runway trends draw on a new breed of sexy dressing, inclusive of cutouts and sheer materials. Conceal and reveal construction informs new materials and patterns, such as chalky pastels and neutral shades.

In home design, we see this translated into soft wood tones like white oak. Conceal and reveal shows up as mesh, cane and punched designs on furniture and room dividers, giving a glimpse of what is inside.



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
